

8/20 - Chicken Cordon Bleu - Boot scoot and belly up to the country music of Mark Coolidge .


9/4 - Labor Day Bar-B-Q.

LODGE HISTORIAN

Okay, for the few that read this, I did not get an article in the last Antler's. This was due to: I forgot (old age), I just didn't want to, (old age) or laziness (old age), pick one!

The year is 1992, newly Elected Exalted Ruler is Bruce Weber and in his first article to the Lodge, he writes of the future of Lodge #1291, with his plans, over several years to expanding the back room to be used as a possible permanent Lodge meeting room, putting a pool table, darts and even a shuffle board and expansion of the kitchen. He appointed a Planning Committee consisting of all PER's and Trustee's, also asking for membership input. In May, the House Committee met and reported that Larry Copperman was chairman, also kitchen chairman with Bob Cover as bar manager, Jim Crosby in charge of hall rentals and Tom McLane to supervise the janitorial staff. Bob Powers, in the Lodge Secretary's article reports a membership of 704 with an objective of 800 by the end of the year. There were also various interviews with Officers of the Lodge with the Editor, this month with Ed Henson. I wish I could repost some of the interviews but not enough room in the Antler's; the interview with Ed was very interesting! Ed, do you still watch Star Trek? We also sold tickets for a chance to win a wheelbarrow full of whiskey, don't remember who won (see opening paragraph) but can tell you I didn't! How many of you older members remember "Crazy Carol"?

In August, ER Weber reports on the National Convention that he and his wife Gloria, along with Bob and Joyce Cover, attended in Dallas. A special "Thank You" to Ed Stambrosky for his making the wheel for which we used for our ticket drawing, I think we still use it. Also, Kay McConnell, "Just say No" Coordinator for Lakeland thanked the Lodge for their participation and support of her program and involvement in the "Say No To Drugs" parade! I haven't mentioned this yet, but still, all Elk Golfer's start the score with a Plus (+). I don't play golf, is that good?

Moving on, it's December 1992, Bob and Joyce Cover celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary at the Lodge, Bob is also Leading Knight, and Joyce is a past president of the Elkmates. In January, Exalted Ruler reports to the membership that we are now debt free and that the mortgage had been paid off and the plans for a mortgage burning are in the planning stage!!! Jim Crosby (JC) writes an article on our first soft tip darts league, ending with mentioning that he hopes it becomes a successful Lodge function. Jim, it has, thanks to you!

As the Lodge year winds up and Bruce Weber year's ends, Bruce has many accomplishments, first and foremost, paying the mortgage off! Report from the Can Committee that we had collected \$404.97 for the aluminum cans with thanks to Chester Kilgore and Don Fry! Also a report from the Long Range Planning Committee noting they had raised \$4463 the past year through various functions.

And so, the Lakeland Elks Lodge #1291 moves into a new year with a new Exalted Ruler, named next article, unless (see first paragraph) I'm unable to.

a brief history: HARRY-ANNA CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL FLORIDA ELKS CHILDREN'S THERAPY SERVICES, INC.

Way back in the olden days, we're talking the 30s, Past GER and former Governor of Florida, Dave Sholtz, who worked closely with the Florida Crippled Children's Commission, met with a gentleman by the name of Harry Miller. They envisioned and were determined to "care for the . . . unfortunate children unable to help themselves, handicapped by the perversity of nature to face the strenuous battle of life." So began the Harry-Anna Home for Crippled Children. With sympathy and cooperation of various race tracks in Florida, the opening of the home was made possible.

By 1944 the home met with difficult times causing the President of the FSEA to appoint a committee tasking them to determine if Lodges would be willing to provide the support necessary to maintain continued operations.

During 1949, the laundry drying room was converted to a school. By 1951, 65-70 youngsters were being cared for per year with over 17,000 having passed through the doors since they opened. In 1955 the Elks Hospital Foundation Fund, now known as the Harry-Anna Trust Fund, was at \$1,000,000. Seven mobile units started in 1963 serving 88 children in their homes weekly. The hospital was moved for a third time in 1977, and by 1989 there were 92 professionals, 47 inpatients, and more than 3,000 outpatients.

February 26, 1999 saw the official closing of the last Florida Elks Children's Hospital facility. *Florida Elks Children's Therapy Services, Inc.* was born on March 1, 1999.

Services provided now include Evaluation, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Neuro-Development Treatment, Sensory Training, and Therapeutic Listening. All of these services are absolutely free for up to six months (26 treatments) or until therapy goals have been met or need to be met in another way. Florida Elks Children's Therapy Services currently provides services to an average of 330 children a month.



When you make a \$50 donation to the Harry-Anna Trust Fund, you receive a certificate as well as the State President's Pin. In addition to Therapy Services, funds from the Harry-Anna Trust Fund support the Florida Elks Youth Camp. That is another, completely awesome story! To be continued...




